Consent decision making

Brainstorming:

- Strange ideas are welcome
- No judgment
- Everything can be improved: be ambitious, explore other pathways

Questions, discussion, debates:

- Respect of diverse perspectives
- Trust in your ability to share an opinion

Decision:

- Vote, consent decision
